INTRO TO ARTS AT CCH




"Art is the desire of man to express himself, to record the reactions of his personality to the world he lives in."



Pakistan has a rich history in all the visual arts—painting, architecture, textiles and decorative arts, and sculptures. Traditionally, visual arts in Pakistan have been influenced by Islam's preference for geometric shapes. These ancient designs often look "modern" to people in the West. Early pioneers of Pakistani art include Abdur Rahman Chughtai who painted with Mughal and Islamic styles, and Ahmed Pervez who was among the early modernists of Pakistan.
